- Placement of course: III-Year B.Sc. Nursing
- Course description:

This course provides an overview of issues related to climate change and human health in the context of public health. It introduces fundamental concepts of climate change and climate change related human health impacts. This specialization is for those who wish to understand the impact of climate change on health and are committed to protecting the health of populations using the knowledge and skills they will acquire

#### AIMS:

The goal of this course is to enhance student awareness about issues on climate change and its impacts on human health. It teaches numerical data analyses using real-world case studies and literature research. The course hopes to build abilities to analyse causes and consequences of climate change and suggest environmentally sustainable solutions.

# Course Title: Respectful Maternity Care

- Placement of course: IV Year B.Sc. Nursing
- Preamble: RMC is a fundamental right of every childbearing woman. Qualified under graduates with a sound knowledge ensuring a positive outcome for mothers as well as new-borns, and aims to address health inequalities in the future

#### Scope & need:

Nursing is a complex and challenging profession. Nursing professionals must learn and practice multiple skills as they move to advanced level in their career. At higher level of education nurse need to apply the theoretical and evidenced based information that underpins task performance. Offering value added course is the best measure to identify the interest of graduating nurses and to equip them with essential skills.

#### Course objectives

This course is designed to bring awareness raising, information sharing and motivation-building for respectful maternity care (RMC). Participants will begin to change and develop RMC attitudes in themselves, and learn how to facilitate the implementation of RMC in their workplaces and among colleagues who also provide care to women and their new-borns. This course is offered to the final year UG students.
